Information for learners

What we do

Adult Learning is part of Shetland Island Council's Education and Social Care Department.

We run an annual programme of Evening Classes and Family Learning. We also run classes for adults to improve their communication, numeracy and to learn English as an additional language.

We offer a wide variety of classes throughout Shetland - from Unst to Fair Isle, Whalsay to Skeld - covering a wide variety of topics.



How to become a tutor

Initially tutors will have to complete and submit a tutor registration form and a course proposal. This will then be followed by an informal interview. Appointment is subject to a satisfactory Disclosure Scotland check.

Adult Learning tutors come from a range of backgrounds. They have a common desire to share their skills, as well as a willingness to help others.

Qualifications

No special qualifications are needed. Tutors should be knowledgeable and experienced in their chosen subject area and feel confident about tutoring a group of adults.



Training

All tutors are required to take part in the Adult Learning Skills for Tutoring course and induction session. Tutors will be supported by Adult Learning staff.

Payment

Evening class tutors are paid an hourly rate for the time they spend tutoring their class. They are not paid for any preparation, travelling time or expenses.
